LOCATION: "SEAHOME" — NORTH SHORE, MA

With over 32 combined rooms and over 14,500 square feet of living space to date, "SeaHome" was constructed in 1880 for Robert C. Hooper, founder of the Boston Terrier dog breed. Originally designed by the Little and Brown Architectural Firm, "SeaHome" which includes a main house and a guest house, is situated on a private peninsula and offers expansive views of the Atlantic ocean.

After its most recent addition and renovation in 2012, "SeaHome" gained a ground floor exercise/pool room and an upper loggia across the front entry of the house. This addition brought together years of renovations to give the home a more unified look.

Working intimately with the Architects and Builder, Fontrick was able to craft doors and windows that met the highly custom demands of the project. Custom muntins, split species and fixed screen doors were a few of the specialty needs for completion of "SeaHome". The end result was stunning.
